GRANT APPLICATION DEADLINE: April 13, 2018

The bursary in memory of Peter Somerville was created in commemoration of Peter Graeme Somerville (1952-2008). For many years, he was a devoted member of the NBHPCA. The Association benefited from his commitment to many positions within the executive committee. At the time of his death, he represented New Brunswick on the administrative council of the Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association

Purpose:

To provide financial support to participate at a national, provincial or regional Palliative Care conference

Amount: One \$2,000 bursary is available

Criteria and guidelines:

- Any person working with the palliative care population may apply for this bursary.
- Applicants must submit a written report (less than 500 words) explaining what palliative care means to them and how they will benefit from the conference by March 30, 2019.
- One applicant will be chosen.
- The successful applicant will be notified on May 3, 2018 at the annual conference
- A copy of the registration receipt and proof of presence at the conference must be given before funds are given.
- The bursary will only be given to attend national, provincial or regional Palliative Care conference.
- The winner must submit a written summary of the conference to the president of the Education Committee within 2 months after the conference. This summary will be shared with NBHPCA members.
